Suicide is a topic that must be brought out of the darkness

in order to save lives. There are many organizations, like Kevin's Song, working to dispel myths and bring hope and light to the subject so that those in crisis feel comfortable seeking help to recover and reengage fully in life.

While the burden of suicide significantly impacts the working-age population, age 24-64, most workplaces are relatively unprepared to help employees who are struggling with suicidal thoughts or to assist colleagues following the death of a co-worker by suicide. Thankfully, **you can play a powerful role in preventing suicide and responding appropriately when tragedies occur.**

Your workplace can be impacted directly through the suicide of employees or more indirectly through employees who lose family members or friends, or through the loss of clients or vendors to suicide.

Employees are affected when family members, clients, vendors, and others who surround the work team attempt suicide or die by suicide. Because of the stigma associated with suicide, many people are unsure how to respond to a co-worker who had a death in the family due to suicide.

Apart from the immense human cost, suicide deaths often lead to a decrease in productivity and workplace morale when left unaddressed or handled poorly by workplace leaders. When a suicide death of an employee does affect the workplace, the surviving co-workers are often left feeling a mixture of grief, trauma, and guilt that can linger for a long time.

Kevin's Song brings tools and resources to employers and employees to better equip you to help prevent suicides and to better care for those dealing with suicide loss.



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
